



Winter 2025 League Overview

Number of Players: Limited. Up to 44 participants per session

Days & Times: Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday Nights (6PM-8PM and 8PM-10PM options)

Start Date: Monday, January 6th – Wednesday, January 8th 2025

Team Size: One, two, three, or four golfers per team and per bay in competition

Format: Handicaps adjusted weekly with scores averaged for team size

Season Schedule: 8-Weeks with majors and a Championship Round in week 8

Prizes For: Points Leader (Grand Prize) & Runner Up, Low Net Avg, Low Gross Avg

Pairings, Substitutions, and Make-Ups:

- Four golfers in each bay, paired up with other teams depending on occupancy.
- No need to find subs if you can't make it! If at least one team member plays, your team can post a score for that week. Sub scores cannot count without handicap.
- If nobody from your team can make it, you can complete the round during normal business hours by booking a bay or coming in on your membership.
- Designated league bays are first come first serve.

Scoring System:

- Each week, golfers will play 9 holes to create a combined team score, gross and net, based on handicaps that are established week 1 and adjusted weekly
- Scores are then averaged based on the number of players on the team
- Team averages will create standard 9-hole scores which are ranked against the field from all league sessions to earn points
- Points for each week's net average rankings will be awarded based on the number of teams in the field and a progressive weekly multiplier.
- For example, if there are 50 teams in the field 1st place would get 50 points, 2nd place 49, and so on through 50th place.

- Each week will be progressively weighted with the multiplier increasing by 1x weekly. With no points week 1, week 2 would be 1x, week 3 2x to 7x in week 8. Major weeks will also have an additional 2 points added to the multiplier to add to intensity.

Scorecards:

- Venue staff will hand out scorecards to all players as they begin their round.
- Players will fill in their names, team numbers, and 9-hole gross scores.
- Score must be turned into the front desk to be entered into the leaderboard.

Leaderboards: Are available on the website and will go live on the website after round 1. Update emails will be sent out periodically to all league participants.

Terms and Conditions

Entry Fee:

- \$225 – includes 2 hours of weekly playtime for 8 weeks, a great environment for competition and camaraderie, access to league specials, and prizes for top performers!

Participation Requirements:

- Players are expected to commit to all 8 weeks or notify organizers in advance if they will miss any rounds. Missing more than 2 weeks without proper notice may result in disqualification from the final standings.

Pace of Play:

- Players are required to adhere to the 2-hour round limit. Failure to maintain pace may result in penalty strokes or disqualification from that week's event.

Equipment:

- All players must use standard golf equipment compliant with USGA regulations.
- Players found to be using illegal equipment may face disqualification.

Scoring and Integrity:

- Scores must be submitted **on the same night** the round was completed. Each player's score must be verified by at least one other player in their group.
- Any disputes regarding scoring or conduct will be reviewed by Golf VX League Operations, whose decision will be final.

Prizes and Tiebreakers:

- Prizes will be awarded to the **Top Finisher and Runner Up for Points** as well as **Top Finisher for Net Average** and **Gross Average** in the standings at the end of the 8 weeks.
- If there is a tie in the final points, the winner will be determined by comparing final round scorecards from holes 18-1.

Player Conduct: Players are expected to conduct themselves professionally. Any unsportsmanlike behavior, such as cheating, excessive drinking, or disruption, could result in disqualification and removal from the league.
